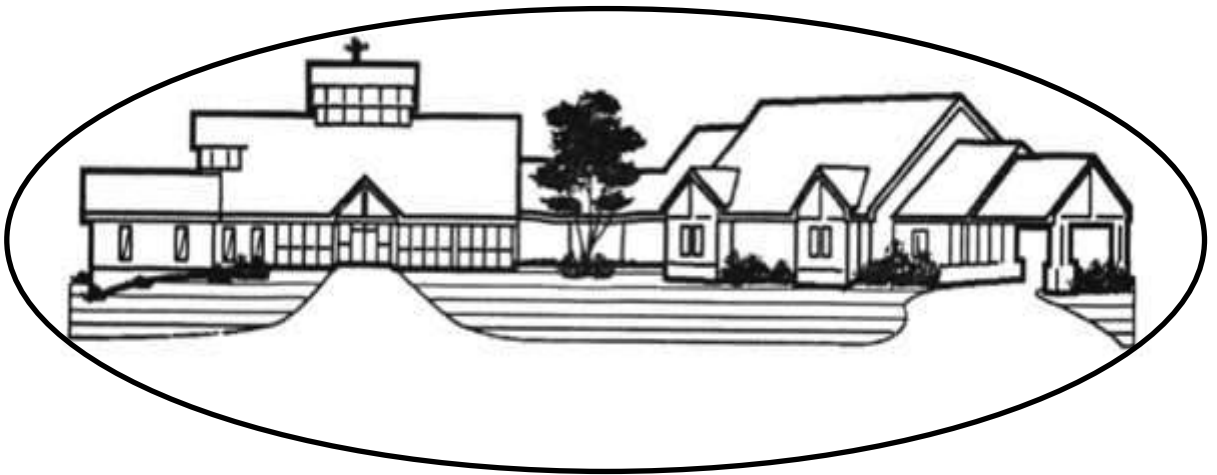

November arrives as the end of the year draws near and we find ourselves looking forward to our two traditional festivals of the month: All Saints Sunday and Thanksgiving.

The Festival of All Saints Day, technically on November 1st but celebrated on the first Sunday of November, is a time when we remember all those whom God has redeemed by the blood of the Lamb and welcomed into His kingdom. Yet, while All Saints Day is properly about *all* the children of God, our minds do naturally drift to those who have gone before us in the faith and now enjoy the presence of Christ in heaven. We remember how we learned from them, especially of Jesus and His Word, and we seek to imitate their walk of faith and the good that they did. The result of such remembering and benefiting is that we give thanks for them. We lift up our praises to God for our family, friends, and predecessors in the faith for their witness to Christ, their leading us by example, and, also, for the grace that God extended to them as well.

We know that they were not perfect just as we are not. Some struggled with sin and the weakness of the flesh more than others. In some cases, they may have let us down more than they blessed or inspired us and, yet, by the mercies of Christ, their sins, too, are covered in faith. They stand forgiven and are now enjoying a righteousness in the presence of Christ that they may never have experienced here. One day we will know them as the new creation that God always intended them to be. For this, too, we give God thanks and praise!

This opens our hearts to a broader thankfulness for Christ Himself and for His atoning death as our substitution. Our gratefulness should know no bounds as we remember that the same grace God has given to those who go before us is the same overflowing grace that He extends to us. We are truly blessed to have a God of second chances who does not hold our sins against us but is willing to wash away the guilt of past failures because Christ has paid their cost. Not only does He not hold past failures against us, but He invites us anew to follow Him and to serve our neighbors in love and join in His kingdom work.

Which now leads us to that other day of celebration that we mark: our National Day of Thanksgiving. A day when all are encouraged to see the generous hand of God who pours out blessings of family & friends, nation, possessions, and opportunities. None of these good gifts do we poor, miserable sinners deserve but we do receive them from our Maker.

I know Pastor adds wording there. I learned it allows the Pastor to select an appropriate Preface according to the Church season. For example, on All Saints Day, which will be November 3rd, if Pastor chooses, a possible wording could be, **“In the communion of all Your saints gathered into the one body of Your Son, You have surrounded us with a so great a cloud of witnesses that we, encouraged by their faith and strengthened by their fellowship, may run with perseverance the race that is set before us and, together with them, receive the crown of glory that does not fade away.”**

If most of you are like the rest of us, you only understand 10% of what you hear. Add the written word, now it shoots up to +90%. Communion is forgiveness of sins and salvation. The Preface wording says, when we are surrounded by our fellow Christians and receiving the sacrament of communion, we are so encouraged and strengthened by each other that we will persevere through this world, we will run the race and disciple all nations, we will seek His forgiveness and receive the crown of glory that is everlasting life.

Out of the Heart

*”[Jesus] called the crowd to him again and said, “Everyone, listen to me and understand. There is nothing outside of a man that can make him unclean by going into him. But the things that come out of a man are what make a man unclean... He continued... In fact, from within, out of people’s hearts, come **evil thoughts, sexual sins, theft, murder, adultery, greed, wickedness, deceit, unrestrained immorality, envy, slander, arrogance, and foolishness.** All these evil things proceed from within and make a person unclean.” (Mark 7:14-23)*

At the urging of the Holy Spirit, Saint Mark records Jesus’ enumeration of thirteen evil things in this list of thoughts, attitudes, and actions that pollute the human heart. There are no mysteries here; these are no “secret sins” Jesus is talking about. If I am truthful with myself, I must admit that I know what each item on the list is, and have seen all of them exhibited in human behavior, whether mine or someone else’s. If I am truthful with myself, I must acknowledge that I know on a personal basis way too much about the damage and destruction that invariably accompanies them. When I conduct the very personal self-assessment that Jesus’ words demand, shall I rejoice that only ten of the thirteen have overcome me at various times in my life? Or perhaps I could take pride that three of them have not yet ensnared me and polluted my heart? Or haven’t they? Truth be told, time and again I have worked *so very hard* not to recognize, confess, and repent of—*turn away from*—the ugly and ungodly things on Jesus’ scathing list. *“What a miserable wretch I am! Who will rescue me from this body of death?”*

As I typed this life-altering question onto the page, what came into my mind most insistently was an old hymn that seized a little boy’s heart many, many, many years ago as his Mother taught him to sing it with her in acapella harmony.

*What can wash away my sin? Nothing but the blood of Jesus.
What can make me whole again? Nothing but the blood of Jesus.
O, precious is the flow that makes me white as snow.
No other fount I know. Nothing but the blood of Jesus.*

To God’s everlasting glory, the shame-filled, polluting power of the thirteen evil things called out by Jesus in Mark 7 are as nothing compared to the power of the cleansing holiness of the blood of the Messiah. And through that unmatched power, the Holy Spirit can confidently urge us to *“not conform to the pattern of this world, but be transformed by the renewal of your mind, so that you test and approve what is the will of God—what is good, pleasing, and perfect.”* Romans 12:2

Most Holy Father, we praise and thank You for washing away the burden of our guilt with the blood of Your Holy One. We praise and thank You for sending Your Holy Spirit to guide us into truth and to mold our hearts into the image of Your Son. Guide us, inspire us, even drag us far beyond the evil things that pollute our hearts and damage those around us to those noble things that are true, honorable, right, pure, lovely, and commendable. We trust in You and Your gracious Son to cleanse us from all unrighteousness.

Do You Know About the Prayer Shawl Ministry?

The Pray Shawl Ministry consists of individuals, usually woman, who donate their knitting and crocheting skills, time, and yarn to create shawls, scarfs, lap robes, etc., of any color and any design. While these garments are being created, they pray for the person who will receive the prayer shawls, praying that they will bring comfort and a feeling that God cares about them personally, that He will be there to sustain them, and that they can bring all their concerns to God and He will hear them. We all know that God will hear our prayers whenever and wherever we pray, but sometimes when one is ill or in a difficult situation, it is nice to have a tangible object for assurance.

The Prayer Shawl Ministry requests that the members of the ESLC congregation assist in the distribution of these prayer shawls. You are the eyes and ears of this congregation and you, as individuals, know when someone is hurting and would benefit from this caring gift. Anyone can receive a prayer shawl; they do not need to be a member of ESLC. You do not need to ask anyone for permission to give a prayer shawl.



If you decide to give a prayer shawl, you need to go to the self-serve kiosk in the Fellowship Hall near the closets where a prayer shawl is displayed. Beside the shawl are bins. Two bins contain the completed prayer shawls. Select the one that you think the person would like, record your gift on the log above the bin with your name, the person that will receive the prayer shawl and the date. We request that if you personally present this prayer shawl that you pray with the person. That is all that is required.

Please include this ministry in your prayers praying that there will always be prayer shawls available when they are needed and they are given to the people who will benefit from this caring gift.

Honduras Team 2025 News

Twenty-one short-term missionaries have committed to serve in Honduras for a week at the end of February 2025. One team meeting has been held in preparation with several to follow. It is an exciting time as we prepare to go to this Central American country to bring aid to a people who largely live in poverty due to the corruption of their government. We go because there is no relief, no help for these people other than the mission teams that travel there. We provide medicine, eyeglasses, dental care, water filters, children's ministry and sometimes a meal of rice and beans. But most of all, we bring the love of Christ. We 21 missionaries stand among hundreds of Honduran men, women and children to simply say we love you, we care about you and we want to help you. We form friendships that though they are only for a week, they are friendships that will live in our hearts for years to come and may possibly change our lives.

We ask for your prayers for our mission, our missionaries and for the people of Honduras that we will meet and serve with while we are there. We have devotions and prayer each morning and evening and we ask you to join us for your prayers are needed for us to succeed. Each team member is responsible for their airfare and mission house expenses and we as a team must raise extra funds for supplies, medicine/medical personnel, translators and Bibles. We do this through fund raisers and donations. See the article on the Helping Hands Gloves fund raiser. We thank you in advance for your support and for your prayers.

SHUT-IN MINISTRY

Beginning January 1, 2025, we are revising our Shut-in Ministry. If you are interested in participating in this ministry of two person teams visiting our members who cannot regularly attend our services. **We are having an informational meeting which will be held at the beginning of the Sunday School hour in Room 301, on Sunday November 3, 2025. It will be a short meeting no more than 15 minutes.** We will briefly detail the process, what is expected of the visitors, when the visits will take place, etc. To date four individuals have committed to making calls on our shut-ins. Join us.



Helping Hands Gloves: Your Honduras team needs to raise funds to support the ministry that will occur while serving there. There is a Ministry Focus Fee (MFF) which includes medicine, a Honduran doctor, a pharmacist, translators for all stations (medical pharmacy, children's ministry, evangelism), drivers, plus 1 coordinator & 1 co-coordinator, children's ministry package (shampoo, conditioner, lice treatment) 2 boxes of Bibles and 2 Boxes of New Testaments, an Optical package a Dental Package, and Water Filters. All this is above the cost to fly there and have food, lodging and transportation for the week and must be raised by the Mission Team.

To do this we will have a fund raiser we call **Helping Hands for Honduras.** On November 3rd team members will be handing out colorful garden gloves to worshippers. We ask that a donation be placed in the glove to off-set the cost of the MFF mentioned above. You can fill the glove with loose change, cash or checks. There will be a return bin next to the members mailboxes once you have filled your glove. There will be extra gloves there in case you missed the team member handing them out. *Thank you in advance for your support.*

GOOD NEWS FROM HAITI

I received a message from Pastor Walta that God had cleared a safe path for he and his family to leave their refuge in Canada and return to their home in Haiti. Because of the political unrest in the country and the dangerous gangs taking control of the capitol city of Port au Prince, he and his family fled to Quebec City Canada earlier this year. His brother remained and continues to work with Trinity HOPE by delivering the bags of rice and beans to the various schools in Haiti – Pas Bonbon being one of the larger schools.

The school has remained open all year, and the enrollment stays at 320 students. The staff is well and we continue to cover their salaries through ESLC. If you are interested in supporting our mission in Haiti, please specify “Trinity HOPE Pas Bonbon” on your donation. Meals remain at twenty-eight cents per child per day, which is a blessing to all of the students. Holiday Candle

On Thanksgiving, we share a special meal with family and friends. Make this holiday candle as a festive centerpiece for your table.

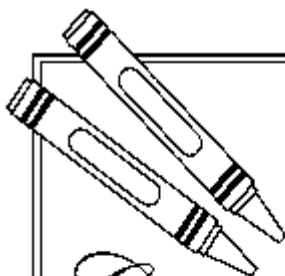
What you need:

- Paper towel
- One 8-oz. clear plastic cup
- Petroleum jelly (Vaseline)
- Paper or plastic disposable bowl
- About 8 oz. of a variety of dried beans, peas, corn, etc.
- Bottle of white glue
- Plastic spoon
- An 8- to 10-inch taper or dinner candle
- Adult to help



What you do:

1. Using the paper towel, rub a generous amount of petroleum jelly on the inside of the cup (bottom and sides).
2. In a bowl, pour the dried-bean mixture.
3. Squeeze enough glue into the bean mixture to generously coat it. Stir the mixture with the spoon.
4. Spoon about half of the bean mixture into the greased cup. Then place the candle, with any plastic wrapping removed, into the center of the mixture. Next, fill the cup with the rest of the mixture. Smooth the top to make it flat, making sure the candle stays straight.
5. Squeeze extra glue around the hole made by the candle. Let the bean mixture dry completely, which could take a day or longer.
6. When the bean mixture is dry, gently pull the candle. Both the candle and beans should come out as one. (If they don't, pour more glue and wait another day.)
7. Place your candle on a small place for a festive Thanksgiving centerpiece.
