

Is Christmas a Pagan Day?

Just the other week in Sunday Bible class, we mentioned the articles I've shared over the years about the false claims of Halloween, Easter, and Christmas being pagan celebrations co-opted by Christians. It was 7 years ago that I shared this article on Christmas and with so many new members in recent years it may be worth reprinting.

We've all heard that Christmas is really just the old Roman Saturnalia or a Winter Solstice celebration overlain with a veneer of Jesus. But is this

accurate? Historian and researcher, Rev. Joe Abrahamson writes:

... [T]he Politically Correct way we are told to understand Christmas is that the Romans celebrated the "rebirth of the sun" on December 25th. Then, Christianity... wanted to eliminate the pagan elements and claimed that Christ was born on this same day to pervert the pagan holiday into a Christian Holy Day.

[To clarify the facts of history] Three main questions [can be asked]:

1) When did the Romans celebrate the winter solstice? It was the shortest day of the year, in our calendar, December 21 or 22. The Romans didn't use our modern calendar... and... the winter solstice hardly ever occurred on December 25. The months were for watching the Moon. The winter solstice would occur on a different day each year because it was based on the Sun.

It is important for us to notice that none of the early Christian writers pointed to the winter solstice as an important religious date. And it is just as important to notice that those early Christian writers wrote that Christ was conceived on what is March 25th in our modern calendar. Nine months later is December 25th.

The winter solstice was not an issue for the Christians of the first four centuries in our calendar. Christ's conception and birth was. December 25th was celebrated in the early church **because** it was nine months after Christ's conception.

2) When did the earliest Christians celebrate Christmas? ... Around the year 200 A.D. the Church Father Hippolytus in his Commentary on Daniel 4.23.3 says: "For the first advent of our Lord in the flesh, when he was born in Bethlehem, eight days before the kalends of January [December 25th], the 4th day of the week [Wednesday], while Augustus was in his forty-second year, [2 or 3BC]"

Clement of Alexandria, who wrote 193-215 AD, in his work entitled "Stromata" writes: "From the birth of Christ, therefore, to the death of Commodus are, in all, 194 years, 1 month, 13 days. And there are those who have determined not only the year of our Savior's genesis, but even the day, which they say took place in the twenty-eighth year of Augustus on the 25th of Pachon..."

Christ's genesis, or conception on the 25th of Pachon was in what our calendar would equate with March 25th. The celebration of Christ's birth would be nine months later: December 25th, in our calendar.

I want to emphasize that I'm not trying to pin down which day Christ was actually born, but to point out when the earliest Christians actually celebrated the birth of Christ. I am also showing that the choice of that date had nothing to do with any pagan celebration of the winter solstice in Rome.

It was not until much much later that scholars and others would begin to claim that Christians tried to mingle the celebration of Christ's birth with the celebration of the winter solstice.

3) When was Christmas associated with the pagan winter solstice? In the 18th and 19th centuries some scholars found a manuscript from the 12th century in a marginal note of the writings of the Syriac biblical commentator Dionysius bar-Salibi conjectured that in ancient times the Christmas holiday was actually shifted from January 6 to December 25 so that it fell on the same date as the pagan winter solstice.

Dionysius did not understand why January 6th was chosen nor did he understand why December 25th was chosen. He just wrote what he thought. From that conjecture a great number of unbelieving academics have woven a fictionalized "history" of Christmas and its relationship to the pagan winter solstice.


Neo-paganism reared its head in the late 1960s in Europe and the United States. And the myth of the winter solstice being the source of Christmas has been preached from college professors to four generations of students trying to comply so they could earn their degrees.

. . .

Christmas is not a pagan holiday. December 25th is not a day stolen by the Christian Church from pagans. It is the day nine months after the early Christians understood when Christ was conceived according to Scripture.

As we round out the year, we reflect on the goodness of God and how He has seen us through another year working alongside Seth sharing His love in our community. The people we met, the encounters we have had and the prayers we have prayed have been a blessing indeed. We are so grateful for all of you who support us with encouraging words, financial gifts and prayers.

And now, a few updates:

- Seth, Jean Dombi and Bob Massa were deployed to Asheville the week of November 4 to offer comfort and love to this hurting community following Hurricane Helene. They were joined by LCC Comfort Dog teams from Hilton Head, SC (Zoara), Hickory, NC (Faith), and Orlando, FL (Peace). The teams visited Emmanuel Lutheran School, a displaced Veterans facility, a Women and Children's Shelter, a fire station, and two separate visits with individuals who just needed some "golden love". Honduras Team 2025 News

We are presently coming up on three months to our mission trip to Honduras. The team is set and busy preparing for the ministry we will conduct while there. You probably saw some of them handing out the gardening gloves for the fundraiser for the supplies we will need. We are thankful for all of the gloves that were taken and would like to say an advanced thank you for your support. If you missed getting a glove there are more in the basket at the Helping Hands display near the mailboxes. That is also where the tub for the return of gloves is located.

We are excited to be part of the re-building that World Gospel Outreach is going through since the pandemic. A new CEO has been called and has just returned from visiting both Honduras and Belize, WGO's two ministry locations. He has previously served in several countries including Honduras and after the trip he shared that he was, "struck anew during this experience with World Gospel Outreach by the purpose and power of the Body of Christ working together to advance the gospel globally." Therein lies the reason that so many missionaries return year after year to serve. Eighty-five percent of our team of twenty are returning to Honduras after previously serving there. Thank you for supporting ESLC's ministry to the people of Honduras.

Toys for God's Kids: In case you did not know, Toys for God's Kids is a group of folks here at ESLC who come together to make toy wooden cars for the children of the world. Of the 3500 cars assembled this year about 80 percent went into Samaritan's Purse shoeboxes in Oconee & Pickens counties. The remaining cars went out with mission teams or were distributed locally. Our ESLC group is just a small part of a nationwide group of folks whose purpose is to bring smiles to the faces of children everywhere and as such the members are known as Smilemakers. TFGK national has the saying "Build the cars as if you were building them for your grandchildren." We embrace that thought and rejoice in the smiles we bring to children, this possibly being the only toy they have.

Thankfully our numbers are growing here at ESLC and the number of cars we can distribute is only limited by how many we can cut out to assemble. Operation Christmas Child Update

A HUGE THANK YOU goes out to all of you that volunteered your time to assembly days, packing shoeboxes, and also staffing our Community Drop-off Location during National Collection Week!! This ministry simply does not happen without many hands and hearts that share the vision of seeing the Gospel go out across the world and into the hands of children everywhere. We more than doubled our shoebox intake from last year!



The following is a story with ties to one of our own:

Kijabe Hospital in Kenya (Where Phil & Margi McLain's daughter works) has hosted many World Medical Mission doctors over the years, and Samaritan's Purse has trained chaplains there in evangelism. This partnership recently opened new doors for ministry through Operation Christmas Child as more than 90 children received shoebox gifts and heard the Good News! The chaplains explained the Gospel in a child-friendly way, gift-filled shoeboxes were handed out, and boys and girls were told, "Yesu anakupenda." That's Swahili for "Jesus loves you." When an invitation was given, many of the children and parents prayed to accept Jesus Christ. A young girl named Ramisa could not attend the group event because she had just been through surgery. She was born with one leg much shorter than the other, and local treatments only led to serious infections. As she grew worse, her mother and brother drove her 10 hours from their home to Kijabe for emergency surgery. Even though she and her family are from a Muslim community, they listened intently as a chaplain shared the Good News when he brought a gift box to her hospital bed. Her mother was grateful and welcomed prayer for her little girl's recovery. One of our staff members said that after Ramisa gently lifted each gift from her shoebox, she "looked up and smiled the sweet smile of a child who knows she is loved." Seeds were planted that day; let's pray this family comes to know the Lord. We want more boys and girls to hear the Gospel and receive a shoebox gift from Samaritan's Purse. We praise God that millions receive Jesus Christ as Lord and Savior each year as Operation Christmas Child is at work in more than 100 countries. Many also grow in faith through our follow-up discipleship course, The Greatest Journey.

Because interest in OCC has overwhelmingly increased, an Operation Christmas Child Committee will be forming soon. If you'd like to be involved, in any capacity, please watch the announcements for the first meeting, coming in January of 2025. Any and all

who are interested in helping, should plan to be there. There are even jobs available that can be completed by those who are home bound and wishing to be more involved. If that includes you, please let your Elder know, and we'll be sure to add your name to the list of those interested in helping! The fields are ripe for harvest, and many hands make light work!



These star cookies will remind you of the star that led the Mag. or wise men, to our Lord Jesus. Enjoy these treats for yourself or give them as gifts.

What you need:

- An actule to help.
- 3 cups flour
- 1 reaspoon baking powder.
- ½ teaspoon salt.
- Leup sugar.
- 1 cup (2 sricks) margarine or butter, softened
- 2 eggs
- 197 teaspoons venilla extract.
- Plastic wrap
- Hard candy such as Life Savers in assorted colors
- Zippered baggies
- Rolling pure
- 2 star cookie cutters, one much smaller than the other
- Alaminum feit.

What you do:

- Mix the floor, baking powder and salt rogether.
- Cream the segar and butter. Add the eggs and vanilla.
- Add the flour mixture and beat until well blended.
- Divide the dough into four equal pieces. Wrap each piece in plastic wrap and refrigerate for about 30 minutes.
- Separate candies by color and place each color in a sealed, zippered baggie. With a rolling pin, crush candy into small pieces (not a fine powder).
- One at a time, roll out each chilled dough piece on a well-floured surface.
- Use the large cookie cutter to make stars, and then place them on a foil-lined cookie sheet.
 Then press the small star cookie cutter into each large star and remove the small piece of star-shaped dough.
- Place some crushed candy in each star-shaped hole.
- 9 Bake at 350 degrees for 10-12 minutes or until golden brown. (The candy will melt and be translucent when cooled, like a stained-glass window.)
